# Project ASSIST Scholar Application

The purpose of Project ASSIST (<u>Advancing Student Success through Interdisciplinary Scholar</u> <u>Training: Preparation Program for Teachers of the Deaf/Hard of Hearing and Audiologists</u>) is to prepare highly qualified professionals with the knowledge and skills necessary to facilitate successful collaboration between teachers of the deaf/hard of hearing and pediatric/ educational audiologists who will support school-age children who are deaf/hard of hearing.

To support students selected for this specialized training, Project ASSIST scholars will receive grant support totaling \$20,000 and up to \$2,000 in conference travel support. Project ASSIST is fully funded and managed by the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP). As such, scholars must strictly adhere to <u>OSEP's requirements and rules</u>. If funded, scholars will be required to provide special education or related services for infants, toddlers, and children with disabilities for two years for every academic year that funding is provided. *If accepted, Project ASSIST scholars will be required to complete the OSEP pre-service agreement.* 

#### **Eligibility:**

Individuals who are seeking a master's degree (MEd) and license/endorsement in teaching children who are DHH in K-12 may apply. To participate in this project, **scholars will need to apply and be accepted into the special education master's program**. Note that, other than information provided by you in this application, your SPED GPA will also be considered in the review process.
