Are you interested in becoming an Early Childhood Special Education Teacher and working in Early Childhood Special Education or Early Intervention (Birth-3 Home Visiting) settings?

OStudents must be working toward a Master's Degree in Special Education and initial licensure in Early Childhood Special Education.

- The grant provides \$14,500 per year in stipends and travel support for two years total of \$29,000!!
- Graduate students might be eligible for a tuition waiver in addition to the stipend (Fall and Spring Semesters 50% max and varies by year and number of benefits available/not guaranteed).

- Interprofessional collaboration through coordinated coursework and special internship opportunities with social workers (specialized coordinated practicum in year two during spring break)
